**GENERAL CITIZEN COMMENTS**

**Donald Feliciano- 192 Stagecoach Lane, Luray**

Mr. Feliciano identified that he is a resident of Page County and continues to appeal to the Town Council in his advocacy of a dog park in Luray. Mr. Feliciano stated that Page County officials have advised they have no interest in constructing a dog park. Despite the lack of interest from the Page County Board of Supervisors, he would like to see the park formed as a potential partnership effort between town and county. Mr. Feliciano would like to see the discussion of a dog park taken seriously and placed on a future Council Agenda.

Councilman Webb advised that he is not opposed to the concept but feels Mr. Feliciano’s approach is not appropriate. Councilman Schiro stated that the Town of Luray owns and maintains hundreds of acres of park land, all of which are dog-friendly. He reminded that these parks are maintained by the taxpayers of Luray and are enjoyed by both Town and County residents alike.

**PRESENTATIONS**

**Luray Downtown Initiative**

Program Director, Jackie Elliott, was congratulated by attendees on the success of the recent Sunflower Festival. Ms. Elliott said this event was a joint effort and thanked Luray Parks and Recreation. Upcoming events for LDI include plans for a downtown Trick or Treat Event on October 30<sup>th</sup> from 4-6pm. PACA will be assisting with the costume contest for the event. Ms. Elliott stated that representatives from Virginia MainStreet will be arriving Wednesday evening. A tour of downtown will take place on Thursday along with discussion on ways to improve efforts. Ms. Elliott noted that last year’s visit was cancelled due to Covid.

**Luray Greenway Foundation**

Vice Chairman, Jim Davis, spoke on behalf of the Hawksbill Greenway Foundation. He reviewed the board members which include; Bill Dudley (Chairman), Margaret Stevenson (Treasurer), Gladys McNemar (Secretary), and long standing Board Member Ken Beyer. Mr. Davis explained that the Foundation continues to serve as the 501c3 organization that allows for Greenway contributions/ donations. Mr. Davis said that the board continues to work with Parks Director, Jen Jenkins, on the Greenway mapping system. He also discussed repairs that are forthcoming to the Ruffner Plaza pergola along with assistance from Parks and Recreation. Mr. Davis hopes to see a Greenway expansion in the future and proposes a plan that would extend toward Yager’s Spring. Lastly, Mr. Davis complemented the Half Marathon that was held on Sunday morning and enjoyed seeing a vibrant downtown/Greenway.

## ACTION & DISCUSSION ITEMS

### Page Coop 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Resolution

Mayor Dofflemyer congratulated the Page Cooperative Farm Bureau on their 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration. Town Manager, Steve Burke, read aloud the Proclamation for attendees and Cooperative Board members were in attendance to accept the Proclamation from Mayor Dofflemyer.

**Motion:** Councilman Schiro motioned to approve the Proclamation of Recognition for the Page Cooperative Farm Bureau's 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Motion seconded by Councilman Sours with the vote as follows: YEA: Council Members Vickers, Schiro, Pettit, Sours, Webb. ABSTAIN: Lillard. **Approved 5-0**

### Town Treasurer/Clerk Reappointment

Town Manager, Steve Burke, requested the Council consider the reappointment of Mary Broyles as the Town Treasurer/Clerk. **Motion:** Councilman Pettit motioned to reappoint Mary Broyles as Town Treasurer/Clerk. Motion seconded by Councilman Schiro with the vote as follows: YEA: Council Members Vickers, Lillard, Schiro, Pettit, Sours, Webb. **Approved 6-0**

### Living Legacy Brownfield Grant Application

Town Manager, Steve Burke, has received a request from the Living Legacy organization for the Town to act as the agent for their application to the Virginia Brownfields Restoration and Economic Development Assistance Fund (VBAF) for a grant to assess the property at 630 West Main Street for environmental issues. The Grant also requires matching funds that the Living Legacy proposes be the acquisition cost of the property. Councilman Schiro inquired about potential financial impacts to the Town. Liz Lewis was on hand to discuss the grant process and said that the funding is on a reimbursement basis, so no liability would be incurred by the Town. Ms. Lewis explained that the grant request is for \$42,000 to complete site assessment and planning. Council members also discussed the ownership of the property and/or transfer of such. Currently the entire property is owned by Mr. King.

**Motion:** Councilman Sours motioned to approve acting as the agent for Living Legacy to pursue a grant for environmental assessment of 630 West Main Street from the Virginia Brownfields Restoration and Economic Redevelopment Assistance Fund. Motion seconded by Councilman Vickers with the vote as follows: YEA: Council Members Vickers, Lillard, Schiro, Pettit, Sours, Webb. **Approved 6-0**

### Campbell Street Parking

Town Manager, Steve Burke, presented a request from Robbie Owens of Payne Insurance Agency, Inc. The request is to remove the time restricted parking directly in front of 7 Campbell Street. Mr. Owens is also requesting that the three spaces located across from his property, alongside the monument, be modified to two-hour parking from the current 15-minute restriction.

Mr. Burke noted that Mr. Scott Zitzer, Domino's Pizza, has requested that the spaces be modified to one-hour parking. Mr. Burke clarified that the two spaces directly in front of Domino's Pizza will remain 15-minute parking.

**Motion:** Councilman Vickers motioned to approve removal of the time-restricted parking spaces in front of 7 Campbell Street and modify the three spaces in front of the monument to one-hour parking. Motion seconded by Councilwoman Lillard with the vote as follows: YEA: Council Members Vickers, Lillard, Schiro, Pettit, Sours, Webb. **Approved 6-0**

### **Website Email Addresses**

Councilman Ligon Webb requested that individual e-mail addresses be returned to the Town website. Mr. Webb felt it would be best for the public to be able to contact Town Council members individually rather than one generic e-mail address. Mr. Burke explained that Form Networks has previously recommended the removal of individual e-mail addresses in order to limit phishing and hacking incidents that have resulted in the past. Council members discussed other localities that utilize individual addresses and the potential for a form based web message to Council members. Member consensus was to implement individual addresses if possible and to correspond with Form Networks regarding this. Mr. Burke said that this will be a component that is included in the proposal for a website upgrade as well.

### **Construction Projects Update**

Assistant Town Manager, Bryan Chrisman, included his report for Council's packets on pending and future construction projects. Projects that were in the report include; Memorial Drive Corridor Improvements, Roundabout & Intersection Improvements, Bridge Maintenance, and various others. Councilman Schiro complemented the report and would like this made available to the public. Councilman Webb inquired about the Memorial Drive Corridor project. Mr. Chrisman explained the improved drainage and sidewalks that will connect to the Valley Health Campus.

### **Town Hall Meeting**

Town Manager, Steve Burke, noted that members had planned to conduct a Town Hall meeting this fall. Members agreed to set a date of October 14<sup>th</sup> at 5:30pm at Ruffner Plaza, with refreshments provided.

### **TOWN ATTORNEY**

Mr. Botkins said he had nothing further this evening.

### **COUNCIL'S COMMENTS**

Councilman Webb complemented the recent joint Towns/County meeting. Councilman Pettit reminded fellow members that a Town representative should be chosen for the Page County EDA. Members will discuss an appointment at the future work session meeting.

The roll was called with two members absent.

## **ADDITIONS OR CHANGES TO THE AGENDA**

**Motion:** Councilman Pettit motioned to add item V-E Code Amendment to Chapter 2-59 Remote Attendance to the Agenda. Council is requested to move item V-E to the first item for consideration before the Public Hearings to allow Council Members to participate remotely. Motion seconded by Councilman Schiro with the vote as follows: YEA: Council Members Vickers, Schiro, Pettit, Webb. **Approved 4-0**

**Motion:** Councilman Schiro motioned to adopt the Code Amendment to Town Code Chapter 2-59 to establish the requirements for remote attendance and participation at Town Council Meetings. Motion seconded by Councilman Pettit with the vote as follows: YEA: Council Members Vickers, Schiro, Pettit, Webb. **Approved 4-0**

## **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

### **Special Use Permit –SUP 21-03- 2 Mechanic Street**

Mayor Dofflemyer stated that he is a member of the Board of Directors for Shenandoah Valley Electric Cooperative, with the principal office located at 180 Oakwood Drive in Mt. Crawford, Virginia. SVEC is submitting an application for a Special Use Permit for consideration by Town Council. Based upon the recommendation from the Town's Attorney, Mayor Dofflemyer stated that he is disqualifying himself from participating in the public hearing, council discussion, and any subsequent vote on SVEC's application in accordance with Section 2.2-3112.A of the Virginia Conflict of Interest Act. Mayor Dofflemyer stated that the Vice Mayor will act as the presiding officer during this portion of the meeting.

Councilman Schiro said that the first Public Hearing of the evening is the Special Use Permit request from SVEC. Town Manager, Steve Burke, presented the request from SVEC to construct a storage building at 2 Mechanic Street (Tax Map No. 42A4-7-D-1) located in the M-1 Zoning District. Town Code requires a Special Use Permit be obtained for any new construction in that district. Construction is also proposed within the existing AE Flood Zone. SVEC has agreed to address any issues regarding the flood zone with the design team as to not present any issues within the flood plain. Mr. Burke said that the Planning Commission did approve the permit at their September 15<sup>th</sup> meeting with a vote of 6-1. Councilman Schiro opened the Public Hearing for citizen comments. With no one wishing to comment on the application, the hearing was then closed.

**Motion:** Councilman Vickers motioned to approve the Special Use Permit to construct a 45x75' storage building at Mechanic Street in the Light Industrial (M-1) Zoning District and the AE Flood Zone as presented. Motion seconded by Councilman Pettit with the vote as follows: YEA: Council Members Vickers, Schiro, Pettit, Webb. **Approved 4-0**

## **Rezoning Parcels 42A17-1-10, 11, 12, & 13- B1 to PND- Baker Development Partnership LLC**

Mr. Burke presented the second Public Hearing of the evening regarding citizen input and consideration of a request from Baker Development Partnership LLC to rezone parcels 42A-17-1-10, 11, 12, 13. The request is to rezone these parcels from Business (B-1) to Planned Neighborhood Development District (PND) and to reincorporate them into the Luray Landing Planned Neighborhood Development. Mr. Burke noted that the Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval at their meeting of September 15<sup>th</sup>.

Mayor Dofflemyer opened the Public Hearing on the amendment to the zoning for Luray Landing. With no citizens present to speak, the hearing was then closed.

**Motion:** Councilman Pettit motioned to approve the rezoning of parcel 42A17-1-10, 11, 12, & 13 from Business (B1) to Planned Neighborhood Development District (PND) and reincorporate the lots into the Luray Landing Planned Neighborhood Development as presented. Motion seconded by Councilman Schiro with the vote as follows: YEA: Council Members Vickers, Schiro, Pettit, Webb. **Approved 4-0**

## **Amendment to Conditional Zoning – Luray Landing**

Town Manager, Steve Burke, presented the final Public Hearing of the evening. The request is from Baker Development Partnership to amend the Conditional Zoning previously adopted for the Luray Landing Planned Neighborhood Development. The amended Developer's Agreement will; 1) establish payment of \$100,000 towards a water tank on property donated to the Town to replace the 12" waterline, 2) establish payment of \$300,000 towards construction of a sanitary sewer lift station by the Town on a lot donated to the Town, 3) payments shall be prorated per lot as each Zoning Permit is issued, 4) the design of all stormwater facilities will be per Page County Code, 5) eliminate offsite street improvements, and 6) eliminate the Town's option to purchase property that the Town has already purchased.

Mayor Dofflemyer opened the Public Hearing for citizen comment. With no comments from the public, the hearing was then closed. **Motion:** Councilman Schiro moved to approve the amendment to the conditional zoning for the Luray Landing Planned Neighborhood Development as presented. Motion seconded by Councilman Vickers with the vote as follows: YEA: Council Members Vickers, Schiro, Pettit, Webb. **Approved 4-0**

## **ACTION & DISCUSSION ITEMS**

### **Appointment to Page Economic Development Authority**

Town Manager, Steve Burke, said that Council is requested to consider a recommendation to the Page County Board of Supervisors for the Town representative to the Economic Development Authority

whose term expires January 31, 2023. Councilman Pettit said that he has made contact with Ms. Meredith Dees, former LDI Director, and asked her for consideration of the appointment to the EDA as the Town's representative. Councilman Pettit noted his tenure on the LDI Board and feels confident that Ms. Dees is extremely motivated and has Luray's best interests foremost at heart. Councilman Pettit recommended Ms. Dees to serve as Luray's EDA representative.

**Motion:** Councilman Pettit motioned to recommend Meredith Dees as the Town's representative on the Economic Development Authority to the Page County Board of Supervisors. Motion seconded by Councilman Schiro with the vote as follows: YEA: Council Members Vickers, Schiro, Pettit, Webb. **Approved 4-0**

### **Joint Meeting**

Mr. Burke noted that Council will need to discuss their representative for the upcoming Joint Session meeting on October 7<sup>th</sup>. The meeting is currently scheduled for 3:00pm at the Hawksbill Recreation Center in Stanley. Councilman Vickers verified that these meetings will be held quarterly. Both Mr. Burke and Mayor Dofflemyer will be in attendance. Councilman Webb stated that he will be attending a meeting with Mr. Burke at 12:30 and will be glad to attend the 3:00pm Joint Session on behalf of the Council.

### **Page Valley News Website Advertisement**

Town Manager, Steve Burke, noted the next item for consideration is the proposed advertising opportunity with the *Page Valley News* website. Mr. Burke provided several options for advertising that were also discussed at the August Work Session of Town Council. Funding for this was not included in the FY22 Budget, however; ARPA funding may be utilized for the expense. Councilman Schiro felt this would be a good marketing presence in light of the diminishing marketing on behalf of the Chamber.

Mr. Randy Arrington, *Page Valley News*, presented information on advertising opportunities to the Council and provided a handout to members. Mr. Arrington provided statistical data on the *Page Valley News* website and discussed changing trends from print advertising to digital media. He noted the growth of the website since its initial launch in February 2020. Options for advertising include the "Luray News" banner ad, the "Today in History" front page ad, or "Today in History" inside ad. Mr. Arrington discussed the size and location of the ads and that the content is changeable once every seven days and can be linked to specific websites. He noted that the Town of Stanley has used their ads to promote special events for the town.

**Motion:** Councilman Vickers motioned to authorize the Town Manager to advertise on the *Page Valley News* website for an amount not to exceed \$8,000 per year with funding from ARPA funds. Motion seconded by Councilman Schiro with the vote as follows: YEA: Council Members Vickers, Schiro, Pettit. Abstain: Webb. **Approved 3-0**

**West Main Street- Parcel 42A11-A-1A**

Councilman Webb requested the Council discuss leasing a portion of parcel 42A11-A-1A from the Laurance Hotel for development by the Town. Following the August Work Session, Mr. Burke stated that he contacted the Virginia Tech Community Design Assistance Center to request conceptual design assistance. Mr. Webb said a meeting will take place on October 7<sup>th</sup> with CDAC representatives to discuss conceptual design ideas. The development of the .34 acre parcel could be utilized as a pocket park, vending stalls, public parking, or other downtown amenities. Mr. Burke said that the application that was submitted and the meeting will take place on the 7<sup>th</sup>, then CDAC will come back with a proposal and Council can determine if they would like to move forward.

**ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Mayor Dofflemyer reminded of the upcoming Community Meeting on October 14<sup>th</sup>. As instructed by Council, staff will arrange for hot dogs, drinks, and chips for the evening. Council agreed to keep the meeting comfortable and informal to provide for a “listening session” environment. Mr. Burke said that the Page News & Courier will be incorporating an article on the meeting. The time is scheduled for 5:30-7:00pm.
